Easy **access and communication** with your primary care team to ask questions or get help.

Your care team includes a **coordinator** to help organize your care inside and outside the clinic, and to support you in achieving your goals.



You work with your care team to create a **personal care plan** that is available to you and all your health care providers.



You receive **complete care** ranging from disease prevention to complex and chronic condition management.



Respect for language, culture and religious beliefs. Health care homes are **for everyone**.



We will work with you to promote **healthy living** so that you can enjoy good health.

WHO IS ON A HEALTH CARE HOME TEAM?

You. As a patient, you are the most important member of the care team. Your needs and goals come first.

Your family. For many patients, family members are needed to support their care.

Your provider. Your physician, nurse practitioner, or physician assistant is your partner in care to provide information, listen to your needs, and help you make wise choices to improve and maintain your health.

Your care coordinator. Your care coordinator organizes care and services you receive inside and outside the clinic. This is the first person you call if you have questions or need help. Your care coordinator keeps your care plan up to date and supports you in meeting your health goals.

Other care providers. Depending on your needs, other health professionals inside and outside the clinic may be included in the care team. For example, a community health worker, dentist, pharmacist, or mental health professional may be part of the care team.
